MATERIALS: Starbursts, Toothpicks

WHAT YOU DO: Divide into pairs, give each person the same amount of Starbursts (5 -make sure the colors are the same!) and toothpicks (10). Have each pair sit backto-back. One person will be the 'architect' and one the 'builder.' The architect has two minutes to build a structure using the materials. Then they have five minutes to explain how to build the structure to the builder. The goal is to have the structure that is the most similar at the end of the time.

CONSENT SCENARIOS

SCENARIO 1

SCENARIO 2

SCENARIO 3

On the other hand, the good part about SnapChat is that the pictures disappear, so no one would ever know. You've never done this before and you don't want to hurt this person's feelings or damage your relationship with them. You really like them and you want them to keep liking you. What do you do?

SCENARIO 4
